L03 Framing the Problem	Frame a policy topic in terms of the health problem, primary cause and root causes
L04 Root Cause Analysis	<ul> <li>Create a cause/effect "fishbone" diagram to analyze the root cause(s) of a problem</li> <li>Identify and prioritize modifiable causes as targets of a policy brief</li> <li>Outline the problem statement for your policy brief</li> </ul>
L05 Gender Analysis for Policy Development	<ul> <li>Describe how gender affects health status as well as the policy environment</li> <li>Use gender analysis to analyze a health problem and policy options</li> </ul>
L06 Epidemiologic Measures in Policy Briefs	<ul> <li>Use basic and advanced health measures to describe a single population</li> <li>Use basic and advanced health measures to compare two or more populations</li> <li>Determine which measures are most useful to tell which stories</li> <li>Explain measures from the public health literature</li> </ul>
L07 Identify Policy Options	<ul> <li>Develop policy options that address root causes</li> <li>Analyze feasibility of policy options</li> <li>Identify evidence to assess options</li> </ul>
L07b Policy Implementation & Enforcement	<ul> <li>Discuss why implementation and enforcement are important to consider during policy design</li> <li>Identify different mechanisms that can be used to achieve behavior change</li> <li>Assess when sanctions are appropriate for policy enforcement</li> <li>Consider how various factors could influence implementation and enforcement of your policy options</li> </ul>
L08 Stakeholder Identification and Mapping	<ul> <li>Identify and map stakeholders</li> <li>Prioritize and plan for stakeholder interviews/engagement</li> <li>Conduct stakeholder analysis</li> </ul>









L09 Framing an Economic Evaluation	<ul> <li>Define economic evaluation and its components</li> <li>Understand the benefits of economic evaluation methods for public health decision-making</li> <li>Apply key economic evaluation concepts, such as time frame, analytic horizon, and perspective to your policy topic</li> </ul>
L10 Assessing Health Impact	<ul> <li>Understand why models are used in public health</li> <li>Construct a decision tree model to estimate the health impact of a policy option</li> <li>Calculate expected value</li> </ul>
L11 Cost Analysis	<ul> <li>Define program cost analysis and cost of illness analysis</li> <li>Develop a cost inventory for your proposed interventions</li> <li>Calculate the costs of your proposed intervention using a decision tree model</li> </ul>
L12 Economic Evaluation	<ul> <li>Describe the basic concepts of a full economic evaluation</li> <li>Define the most common economic evaluation methods and identify when to use them</li> <li>Understand why we discount future costs and benefits</li> <li>Perform a basic cost-effectiveness analysis using a decision tree model</li> </ul>
L13 Sensitivity Analysis	<ul> <li>Recognize the value of sensitivity analysis</li> <li>Identify and test model inputs and assumptions using sensitivity analysis</li> <li>Present the findings of sensitivity analysis</li> </ul>
L14 Effective Writing	<ul> <li>Write for your audience or stakeholders</li> <li>Be aware of common errors of grammar and syntax to avoid</li> <li>Understand techniques that can be used to craft clear, concise sentences and paragraphs</li> </ul>
L15 Writing the Problem Statement	<ul> <li>Identify the key information needed to write a problem statement</li> <li>Use the materials developed during mentoring sessions to write an effective problem statement</li> </ul>
L16 Writing Policy Options	<ul> <li>Summarize effective interventions, accounting for all aspects of feasibility</li> <li>Visually display the options in a way that clearly makes the case for one option over others</li> <li>Evaluate policy option sections within briefs</li> </ul>
L17 Making and Writing Recommendations	Discuss the elements of a good recommendation     Write a compelling recommendation and call to action
L18 Data Visualization and Presentation	<ul> <li>Discuss the characteristics of good visualization</li> <li>Identify data stories and the most appropriate visualization types for each</li> <li>Use guidelines to create the most effective visualization(s) for your policy brief</li> </ul>
L19 Writing Key Messages and Title	<ul> <li>Describe what makes a good key messages section</li> <li>Distill your policy brief content down to 2-3 key messages</li> <li>Describe what makes a good title</li> <li>Develop an effective title for your policy brief</li> </ul>
L20 Advocacy Strategy and Communications	<ul> <li>Analyze the policy and advocacy environment</li> <li>Describe ways you can advocate for policy change</li> <li>Use the template provided to create a PowerPoint to present your policy brief</li> <li>Develop an effective elevator pitch</li> </ul>
